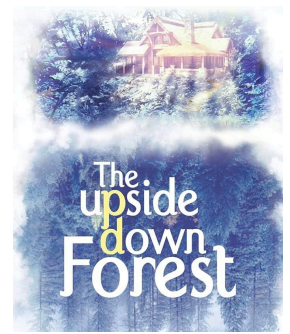


“The Upside Down Forest”

Alliteration is when you use similar letters in two or more words for example: Ralston Rabbit and Felicia Fox

Do you think there is a particular “lie” that the snake says that you would listen to?
